About The Treatment

Two hair analysis are carried out at the beginning and end of the treatment to monitor the progress. Oral medication does not stop hair loss alone, it might stimulate blood circulation for a few hours but hair will still fall. The products used in this treatment have been approved by the US food and drug administration.

Administration takes just 20 minutes and patients need only attend once a week for four weeks then fortnightly for five months. The treatment is non-evasive. During the course a Hair checks are carried out to monitor on the condition and shedding percentages of the hair, photos are also taken at this point.



Is a Hair Transplant Right For Me?

You may be a candidate for hair transplant surgery if you have healthy hair growth at the back and sides of the head to serve as donor areas.




- Donor areas are the places on the head from which grafts are taken.
- Other factors, such as hair color, texture and waviness or curliness may also affect the cosmetic result.
- There are a number of techniques used in hair replacement surgery. Sometimes, two or more techniques are used to achieve the best results.
- Hair transplant surgery can enhance your appearance and your self-confidence, but the results won't necessarily match your ideal.
- Before you decide to have surgery, think carefully about your expectations and discuss them with your consultant.

It's important to understand that all hair transplantation techniques use your existing hair. The goal of surgery is to find the most efficient uses for existing hair.

Remember, there are limits to what can be accomplished. An individual with very little hair might not be advised to undergo hair transplant surgery.

Frequently Asked Questions about HLC Hair Transplant

Take a look at some of the common questions regarding Hair Transplants.

How much will it hurt?

Honestly, you'll probably be pleasantly surprised. When you read about the procedure, it seems a tad gruesome – but the fact is, there's no pain with the surgery, just a little discomfort. You have unaesthetic so there's no pain. The discomfort comes from being in the chair for up to six hours for the entire process to be completed, though you will get regular breaks. Post-op, you might experience some mild pain but nothing that your standard painkillers can't manage for a few days, just like with any minor surgical procedure.

How noticeable will the scarring be?

Follicular unit grafting requires tiny incisions to the recipient area and any resultant scarring is generally invisible to the untrained eye. There will also be a small scar from the donor area at the back of your scalp, but it will be hidden under existing hair.

How long before signs of growth are visible?

After the procedure, the hair grows very slowly but as time passes, you'll probably have people asking if you've lost weight; they'll notice 'something' but won't be able to pinpoint the physical change in you, especially if you've only had minimal work done. No need to tell anyone. Lots of guys get away with no one figuring it out.

Will everyone know?

In order to best maintain your hair system it's always good to wash it twice per week, always hydrate your hair everyday with a good leave in conditioner.

Will the results be permanent?

The hair follicles that are transplanted are genetically-resistant against baldness so they will, in theory, continue to grow over your lifetime. However ... You'll still notice hair loss on different areas of your head, and may choose to explore the option of another transplant or HLC laser treatment in the future.

How long will I need to rest?

You'll generally only need to take it easy for a couple of days after the procedure. Take it easy while allowing your body to recover. Avoid over-exerting yourself and leave the gym, running for a few weeks.

Can I use someone else's hair for a hair transplant?

Unlike organ transplants, you are your own donor for a hair transplant. There is no donor and recipient. If you received hair, follicles, and tissue from someone else your body would reject them.

Can hair transplant give full head of hair?

If you're completely bald, a hair transplant will probably produce an improvement, but it's not going to give you a completely full head of hair. However, if you have minor hair loss and plenty of donor hair, a hair transplant can help you reverse several years of hair loss and improve your appearance.

Is hair transplant surgery just for men?

Hair loss can affect both men and women. While FUE hair transplant is more popular among men, it is also a method widely used for women experiencing female pattern hair loss.

Where are donor hair follicles being extracted from?

In order for a hair transplant procedure to be successfully performed, individual follicular units are extracted from the patient's donor area and are then transplanted into areas where the patient desires more hair. If someone else's hair is implanted in your body, your body is likely to consider it as foreign and will therefore reject it. In addition, if the severity of hair loss is high and you are experiencing lack of adequate donor hair, then most likely a FUE hair transplant will not be the best option for you.


Is there an age limit on who can undergo a hair transplant procedure?

Usually patients between the ages of 20 and 50 are considered as the most suitable candidates for a hair transplant surgery. However, this does not always have to be limited within this specific range. Even though each individual is different, it is more likely to achieve a successful hair transplant when the person is slightly older. At a younger age, hair loss and hair growth pattern can be irregular and hair loss may continue to worsen as the person gets older. As time passes by, you may have to undergo more procedures. As long as you are in good health there is no upper-age limit for hair transplantation. For this reason it is not generally advisable to undergo a hair transplant surgery under the age of 20.

Scalp Micropigmentation

Whether you've just started thinning or have already lost most of your hair, Scalp Micropigmentation will work creating the look of a hair follicle.

What is Scalp Micropigmentation (SMP)?

Whether you've just started thinning or have already lost most of your hair, Scalp Micropigmentation will work creating the look of a hair follicle and your correct hair colour throughout bald or balding areas, this allows the client to achieve the look of a full head of short cropped hair immediately or fill in any thinning areas to create the appearance of a fuller head of hair this will then lead to a rise in self confidence.

Scalp Micropigmentation is a solution for those that suffer from pattern baldness, alopecia, diffuse thinning and for those that have lost a lot of hair.

Scalp Micropigmentation treatment is also great for those with only minor thinning or recession. Scalp Pigmentation can help add density to thinning areas, creating an undetectable illusion of thicker and fuller hair. Giving you the look of a full head of hair & style.

Scalp Micropigmentation is pigment implanted underneath the skin's outer layer into the dermis layer. The initial layer of your skin is known as the Epidermis. Underneath the Epidermis is the second layer known as the Dermis layer of your skin. The Dermis layer is split into two, you have the upper layer and the lower layer, the difference between a tattoo and Scalp Micropigmentation is that with SMP the pigment is implanted into the less painful upper layer.

Scalp micropigmentation is an innovative, non-invasive treatment that produces really quick results. The procedure is certainly not as time-consuming to administer as a hair transplant and recovery times are quick. It doesn't involve the waiting game as is the case for medicated solutions for promoting hair growth and with SMP, you'll see a result immediately.

The treatment can last from 2-5 hours depending on complexity of the case.

Please remember SMP isn't a way of promoting actual hair growth but it is for giving the illusion of hair.

How does SMP transform the appearance of thinning hair?

It works by a technician implanting natural pigments just below the surface of your skin using a machine that's been fitted with a microneedle. Once healed, the series of tiny dots that have been implanted provide the appearance of hair follicles that sit underneath the hairline giving the impression of density – similar to the hair fibres and colouring sprays in todays market, only SMP is a more permanent solution.



Who can benefit from Scalp Micropigmentation?

- Male and female pattern baldness
- Diffuse thinning
- Alopecia
- Scar concealments
- How many treatments should I expect?

Scalp Micropigmentation is rarely a 1 treatment process. Most clients can expect between 2-4 sessions to complete their treatment depending on the extent of Hair Loss or scarring. These treatments are usually spaced about 2-3 weeks apart.

How long do the results last?

After completion of your treatment (2-4 sessions) a client should expect the strength of the colour to last for many years (on average 5 years) before the pigment will very gradually begin to slightly lighten. When this occurs the client can undergo a brief "touch up" session to restore any fading and secure many more years of their style.

Does Scalp Micropigmentation hurt?

In reality, offering an accurate answer to this question is extremely difficult to do as pain thresholds vary. However, if you undergo treatment it is administered using a needle. It doesn't penetrate particularly deeply into the skin, however, it does break the skin's barrier and underneath that said barrier are pain sensors. So you will feel a sensation.

Because we don't have a completely clear answer to the question, we are going to base this on feedback given. And the overwhelming and general opinion is... the initial shock factor when treatment begins can certainly be construed as light pain. However, this quickly subsides and the feeling of pain is overtaken by just a sensation. Not particularly comfortable, not particularly uncomfortable. However, it is noticeable.

Tips to help with ensure your treatment is as comfortable as possible..

Ensure you are relaxed when you arrive at the clinic. Wear comfortable clothes, bring headphones, get your favourite playlist on standby and be yourself. The procedure can last the best part of half a day and so you may as well treat the experience as a leisurely one.

Ask your technician about numbing cream that can be applied in advance. If you really feel the need for this, your practitioner is the one who can suggest the best product. Consider taking a codeine-based pain killer before you arrive at the clinic. Avoid at all costs Aspirin as it is a known anticoagulant and if you are taking any other type of blood-thinner certainly seek medical advice before undergoing Scalp Micropigmentation treatment.

To conclude, always remember that the discomfort you'll experience is worth it. Scalp Micropigmentation is a treatment that is life-changing. It is known to not only conceal the devastation that hair loss induces but can restore broken self-esteem and confidence levels.

How realistic does it look?

The finish is absolutely flawless, and looks incredibly realistic, for a male looking for the shaven 'buzz cut' style the only way someone would know is if they touched the treated area and felt the lack of stubble. The best way to keep the look realistic is to shave your head as often as you can. For a female the treatment is pretty much undetectable.

Can i choose what hairline i want?

Injectable Solutions Treatments


An explanation of our Injectable Solutions Treatment for hair loss.

What is Injectable Solutions Therapy?

Injectable Solutions is a non surgical treatment for hair loss that uses your own body's ability to heal itself by stimulating skin and follicle recovery. The activated platelets release different growth factors which enhance the natural healing process of the skin & follicles.

What's the process of Injectable Solutions?

Firstly, the blood is collected, a small quantity of the patients own blood is collected from the arm. The blood is then treated in a centrifuge machine that spins rapidly to separate the fluids of different densities, which separates the platelet plasma from the red blood cells. The platelet plasma is then drawn up into a syringe and injected into the scalp by an HLC practitioner.

How many treatments will I need?



Alopecia & Treatments

An explanation of the various types of Alopecia and any available treatments.

Androgenic Alopecia

Also known as Androgenic Alopecia or Alopecia Androgenica

This is a common form of hair loss in both female and male humans. In males in particular, this condition is also commonly known as male pattern baldness.

Hair is lost in a well-defined pattern, beginning above both temples. Hair also thins at the crown of the head. Often a rim of hair around the sides and rear of the head is left, or the condition may progress to complete baldness.

The pattern of hair loss in women differs from male pattern baldness. In women, the hair becomes thinner all over the head, and the hairline does not recede. Androgenic alopecia in women rarely leads to total baldness.



Alopecia Areata

This is a highly unpredictable, autoimmune skin disease resulting in the loss of hair on the scalp and elsewhere on the body. This common but very challenging and unpredictable disease affects approximately 1.7 percent of the population.

Due to the fact that much of the public is still not familiar with alopecia, the disease can have a profound impact on one's life and functional status, both at work and at school.

In Alopecia Areata, the affected hair follicles are mistakenly attacked by a person's own immune system, resulting in the arrest of the hair growth stage. Alopecia usually starts with one or more small, round, smooth bald patches on the scalp and can progress to total scalp hair loss (Alopecia Totalis) or complete body hair loss (Alopecia Universalis).

Alopecia Totalis

This is the loss of all head hair. Its causes are believed to be an autoimmune disorder. Stress is sometimes thought to be a contributor to the hair loss caused by alopecia, however many people leading relatively stress-free lives have experienced the symptoms.

Alopecia Universalis

or alopecia areata universalis is a medical condition involving rapid loss of all hair, including eyebrows and eyelashes. It is the most severe form of alopecia areata, with an incidence of .001% (1 in 100,000).

Traction Alopecia

is most commonly found in people with ponytails or cornrows who pull on their hair with excessive force. In addition, rigorous brushing and heat styling, rough scalp massage can damage the cuticle, the hard outer casing of the hair. This causes individual strands to become weak and break off, reducing overall hair volume.

Trichotillomania

is the loss of hair caused by compulsive pulling and bending of the hairs. Onset of this disorder tends to begin around the onset of puberty and usually continues through adulthood. Due to the constant extraction of the hair roots, permanent hair loss can occur.

Traumas such as childbirth, major surgery, poisoning, and severe stress may cause a hair loss condition known as telogen effluvium, in which a large number of hairs enter the resting phase at the same time, causing shedding and subsequent thinning. The condition also presents as a side effect of chemotherapy – while targeting dividing cancer cells, this treatment also affect hair growth phase with the result that almost 90% of hairs fall out soon after chemotherapy starts.

Radiation

to the scalp, as when radiotherapy is applied to the head for the treatment of certain cancers there, can cause baldness of the irradiated areas.

Alopecia Barbae

is an immune malfunction which results in hair-less patches appearing in the beard region. In simple terms the immune system gets confused and begins to attack the hair follicle thinking that it is an invader to the body.

The good news is that thousands of men have been able to reverse their alopecia problems using our specially prepared product.

The auto-immune problem is known as alopecia areata. Within it there are a number of different sub-groups (names given to describe the extent of hair loss and the area that it attacks). At one extreme, there is alopecia universalis – total loss of every hair on the entire body and at the other end of the scale, a single patch on the face or scalp may appear.

Telogen effluvium

is a scalp disorder characterized by the thinning or shedding of hair resulting from the early entry of hair in the telogen phase(the resting phase of the hair follicle). Emotional or physiological stress may result in an alteration of the normal hair cycle and cause the disorder, with potential etiologies including eating disorders, fever, childbirth, chronic illness, major surgery, anemia, severe emotional disorders, crash diets, hypothyroidism, and drugs.

About Hair Analysis

HLC carry out the most advanced microscopic polarised light analysis of the hair, this type of analysis is essential in pinpointing various conditions affecting the hair growth.

Many of the problems affecting hair growth are reflecting symptoms of other conditions elsewhere in the body. This may be stress related, hormonal problems, nutritional, genetic, medical, mineral and vitamin imbalances.

The idea is to seek out the cause of the problem, then give the correct treatment. If you wish to get your hair analysed, all you have to do is contact us directly or, download the hair analysis form below. Click on the image below, to download, then simply print it off and complete. You will need to return the form to us in the post along with your hair sample and payment.

Pluck a sample of hair from the scalp (using fingers or tweezers), from an area of scalp near the problem area. This is important as a sample from a different area of the scalp may give a misleading result. We need at least 10-20 hair bulbs for an accurate analysis. These should be growing hair NOT hair that has already fallen. The hair sample can then be wrapped in paper and placed in an envelope together with the hair analysis form.
